

Rural applicants will need to complete the RES Statutory Declaration form. Available in the 'Rural Details' tab of the Medicine Application Portal.

STEP 1: SIT UCAT ANZ

Register for the test between 1 March – 17 May 2022 via www.ucat.edu.au. Sit the test some time between July – August. There is free preparation materials on the UCAT ANZ website.

STEP 2: APPLY FOR THE COURSE

Add Doctor of Medicine (UAC code 725505) to your Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) preference list and select which university you would prefer to study at, www.uac.edu.au Applications close 30 September 2022 (TBC).

STEP 3: RURAL & INDIGENOUS APPLICANTS

Rural applicants (via your UAC account)

Confirm your remoteness area through Doctor Connect.

Download the 'Community Member Confirmation Form', fill it out and upload it back to your UAC account by 30 September (TBC). You can download the form via https://bit.ly/3ggkakh

STEP 3: APPLY TO THE UNIVERSITIES

Complete the Joint Medical Program online application form by 30 September 2022 (TBC), https://bit.ly/1KfdjAl

Applicants successful in gaining entry to this program will be offered a place at either university based on their stated enrolment location preferences listed on their JMP direct online university application. There is no guarantee that candidates will be allocated their preferred location.

STEP 3: JOINT MEDICAL PROGRAM ASSESSMENT

Based on UCAT results, you may be shortlisted to participate in the one-day Joint Medical Program Assessment, https://bit.ly/2zfWAkn

The assessment has two parts – Personal Qualities Assessment and Multiple Skills Assessment (both on campus).

Dates

Applicants from NSW, QLD & ACT and rural applicants from all states (including Victoria): late November – early December 2022 (TBC)

All other non-rural interstate applicants - mid to late January 2023.

SELECTION CRITERIA

ATAR

General entry - 99.95+ Indigenous applicants - 90+

Prerequisites

VCE: Unit 3-4 Mathematical Methods – minimum study score of 30.

HSC: Minimum bands for either Mathematics (Band 4) or Mathematics Extension 1 or 2 (Band 3).

Other

Assessment process (written assessment and panel discussion) for short listed applicants.

Note: Indigenous applicants who wish to be considered under the Gadigal Program need to submit their UAC application along with a separate Gadigal Program application directly to the University.

ENTRY INTO THE MD

Most students who meet the requirements of the Bachelor degree - including maintaining a certain Grade Point Average, won't have to sit the GAMSAT or participate in the assessment process for entry into the MD.


STEP 2: ASSESSMENT DAY

Shortlisted applicants only

Based on your VCE/HSC results and ATAR, you may be shortlisted to participate in the Assessment Day. This involves a written assessment and panel interview. This date is non-negotiable and will be held in December 2022 and January 2023 (TBC).

STEP 3: OFFERS

Offers will be released via UAC in December 2022 and January 2023 (TBC).



GRADUATE ENTRY

Year 12 students don't apply for this pathway – but it's important to understand your options if you don't achieve direct entry into medicine.

- Grade point average and academic achievement of Bachelor degree
- Interview (short-listed applicants)
- Apply during final year of Bachelor degree or Honours year.

The following are suggested ANU pathway courses into the MChD. Note some students completing these pathway courses won't be required to sit the GAMSAT.


