La Trobe is home to one of Australia's oldest podiatry schools, currently training over one-third of the country's podiatry students.

The Bachelor of Podiatry (Honours) offers a world-class curriculum combined with a clinical program to prepare you for a career in Australia.

You'll learn how to treat and manage conditions of the foot and lower limb, bone and joint disorders, plus neurological and circulatory diseases.

You'll complete either a major industry-relevant honours project or a research honours project in the final year of the course.

Industry experience

Gain hands-on experience while completing over 1000 hours of work placements in community health centres, hospitals and at La Trobe's on-campus podiatry clinic.

You'll gain practical experience under the close supervision of a registered podiatrist at our on-campus student podiatry clinic.

Global experience

You'll have the opportunity to undertake clinical placements overseas in Singapore and Glasgow.

You'll learn

Anatomy: Study the anatomy of the lower limb, foot and multiple body systems that function in this region.

Biomechanics: Examine the mechanical principles of human movement and motor control with an emphasis on gait in health and disease.

Podiatric pharmacology: Learn the appropriate drug therapies and their potential benefits, adverse effects and complications.

Cutaneous (skin) pathologies: Undertake a comprehensive examination of dermatological conditions commonly encountered in podiatric practice.

All workplace learning occurs under the close supervision of registered podiatry practitioners.

Following graduation, you can undertake further study to become endorsed to prescribe scheduled medicines or perform podiatric surgery.

International work placement opportunities in the final year of your course in places such as the UK, Singapore and Vietnam, will enable you to gain valuable experiences studying overseas.

Podiatry clinic

The clinic treats up to 240 clients each week and has more than 6000 registered clients, so you will experience the full scope of podiatric practice on-site, including primary healthcare, diabetes management, rheumatology, biomechanics and sports medicine, paediatrics and surgery.

Professional accreditation

The course has been developed to meet the requirements of the Podiatry Board of Australia and the Australian Health Practitioner Registration Authority (AHPRA). Graduates can work in Australia and may also seek registration to practice in New Zealand, the UK, Singapore and Canada.
