Indicative ATAR

Please use indicative ATARs and selection ranks as a guide as they may change for future intakes.



English prerequisite

EAL = English as an Additional Language. 'Any other English' includes English, English Language and Literature.



Undergraduate

This is usually your first course at university. For example - bachelor's degree.



Graduate

This is study you do once you have graduated from a bachelor's degree. For example – master's degree.

HOW TO BECOME A PHARMACIST

STEP 1: complete an accredited degree

Complete an accredited pharmacy degree – either at the undergraduate (bachelor's) or graduate level (master's).

You will need to meet English language requirements, inherent requirements (e.g., communication skills), get or prove you have certain vaccinations and immunisations, and get a Police Record Check and Working with Children Check.

STEP 2: Internship

Complete a 1-year paid internship and intern training program.

STEP 3: Registration Examination

Pass the Pharmacy Board's registration examination.



RMIT UNIVERSITY

Accreditation from the Australian Pharmacy Council (APC) and Approval by the Pharmacy Board of Australia (PBA) allows graduates of the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) Program to enter an approved intern training program in either Australia or New Zealand.

Industry is involved in the delivery of this degree through: Industry Advisory Committees, guest lecturing, and work integrated learning opportunities.

Graduates have gone on to work at a range of organisations, including: The Royal Melbourne Hospital, The Alfred Hospital, The Austin Hospital, and Therapeutic Guidelines.



As a pharmacist, you will ensure safe and effective use of medicines within the community. Career options include working in both community and hospital pharmacies, for the pharmaceutical industry, or in health policy and administration roles.

BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (HONOURS)

As an RMIT pharmacy student you'll benefit from a supportive academic community with diverse research strengths. You'll develop a sound scientific base in studies that include biology, chemistry, biochemistry, biostatistics, physiology, genetics, microbiology and immunology, together with an understanding of the social factors that influence health.

In-depth knowledge of pharmacology, pharmacy practice, pharmaceutics and therapeutics is gained, together with an understanding of drug development, research skills and the option to study business if interested.

INDUSTRY EXPERIENCE

Clinical placement is a key focus throughout this program. Teaching labs are equipped with the latest pharmacy facilities. You'll begin to develop the skills of a pharmacy practitioner in the purpose-built model pharmacy, together with practical work experience in hospital, community and specialist work-integrated learning environments.

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

This four-year program is your first step to becoming a pharmacist. It prepares you for the one-year internship program that you need to successfully complete in order to gain Australia-wide registration. Once you've successfully completed the program and the internship, you can practise in any area of pharmacy in Australia, including community or hospital pharmacy.

PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

The Bachelor of Pharmacy (Hons) program is accredited with conditions by the Australian Pharmacy Council (APC). The program is also approved by the Pharmacy Board of Australia (PBA). To become a registered pharmacist in Australia, graduates must successfully complete a Bachelor degree accredited by both the APC and PBA plus an additional year of internship training and registration examinations.

GUARANTEED PATHWAY

If you don't achieve direct entry into the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours), the following pathway may provide you entry into the course.

Via an Associate Degree

STEP 1: Associate Degree

Complete the 2-year Associate Degree in Applied Science at RMIT. The lowest selection rank for the 2024 intake was 40.30

STEP 2: bachelor degree

Apply for the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours). You will receive credit for 4 units and it will take you 3.5-years to complete the course.

SELECTION RANK ADJUSTMENTS

A maximum of 28 adjustment factors can be added to your VCE aggregate. The aggregate points are added to your combined study scores (VCE Aggregate) and your ATAR is recalculated. The following are ways you can boost your selection rank.

Subject Bonus Points

Applicants can receive up to 8 adjustments onto their VCE aggregate for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. Adjustments are automatically added and you won't have to apply for them. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were Chemistry, Agricultural & Horticultural Studies, Biology, Environmental Science, any Information Technology, General Mathematics, Mathematical Methods, Specialist Mathematics, Outdoor And Environmental Studies, Physics or Psychology. Eligible subjects for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.

Regional Adjustments

For VTAC applicants, the adjustment you can receive is derived from the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) data and whether your address ranks as low, medium, or high-SES based on the ABS's Statistical Area 1 (SA1) measure. If your address is classified as LOW, you will receive an adjustment of 5 aggregate points.

Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

Applicants can receive up to 16 adjustment points for short or long-term disadvantage. Applicants can apply for this scheme via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) between 29 July – 11 October 2024 after creating their VTAC account and adding course preferences.

Schools Network Access Program (SNAP)

This scheme is only for partner schools. Applications are made via SEAS.

RMIT Elite Athlete Program

Eligible applicants will receive up to 10 adjustment points. Click here for information.

EXAMPLE

Meet Will

Will wants to maximise his chances of getting an offer for Pharmacy at RMIT so he does the following:

Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC)

He formally applies for the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) via VTAC. Applications open 29 July 2024.

Special Education Access Scheme (SEAS)

He completes an application for SEAS via VTAC so he is eligible for equity adjustments towards his selection rank. He is eligible for Category 1 (Personal Information and Location) and Category 3 (Disability and Medical Condition). He uploads a supporting statement from a medical practitioner as evidence for Category 3.

Backup course

He places the Associate Degree of Applied Science at RMIT on his VTAC preference list as a back-up course in case he doesn't receive an offer for the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours).

Outcome

Will received a competitive ATAR and met the entry requirements for the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours). His selection rank was higher than the lowest rank for the December round and he received a formal offer for the course via VTAC.

Across your next two years, you'll focus on subjects such as pharmacy practice and therapeutics (treatment of diseases). You'll delve into public health – examining issues in rural and remote Australia and across Indigenous communities. You'll also learn about the dynamic digital health space.

PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

The Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) program is accredited by the Australian Pharmacy Council (APC). After graduation, you'll be eligible to complete a one-year internship and take the Australian Pharmacy Board exams to qualify as a professional pharmacist.

BOOST YOUR SELECTION RANK!

A maximum of 20 aggregate adjustment points can be granted. The aggregate points are added to your combined study scores (VCE Aggregate) and your ATAR is recalculated. The following are ways you can boost your selection rank.

Subject adjustments

Applicants can receive a maximum of 12 adjustments onto their VCE aggregate for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. Adjustments are added automatically, and you won't have to apply for them. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were: Biology, Chemistry, any Mathematics, Physics and LOTE. Adjustments for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.

Priority Access Program

A maximum of 15 adjustment factors are awarded to applicants who fall within any of the following categories: priority school (5), priority campus (5), regional school (5).

Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

DOUBLE DEGREE

Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours)/Master of Pharmacy

The pathway to registration as a pharmacist in Australia generally takes five years.

Traditionally, this has been structured as a four-year bachelor degree plus a one-year internship. Our Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) / Master of Pharmacy takes the same amount of time but instead you'll graduate with a master as well as a bachelor. The Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) and Intern Training Program components of the program are accredited by the Australian Pharmacy Council and approved by Pharmacy Board Australia. High achieving students can apply for the Scholars program.

SINGLE DEGREE

Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours)

If you are a domestic student who wishes to initially commit to four years of study instead of five, you may want to enrol in the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) in the first instance. You can choose to switch your enrolment to the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours)/Master of Pharmacy at any time in your degree; note that this fifth year of study, which includes a paid internship, is required to register to practice as a pharmacist in Australia.

Via a higher education pathway

STEP 1: tertiary study

Complete at least one year of full-time study (48 credit points) of a recognised university degree with a minimum average mark of 70%. Prerequisite studies in Chemistry, English and Mathematics must be met at either the VCE or tertiary level.

STEP 2: pharmacy degree

Apply for any of the undergraduate entry pharmacy degrees at Monash.

Via the Graduate Entry Pharmacy Program at Monash

STEP 1: tertiary study

Complete a bachelor degree in a relevant science related degree and achieve a minimum distinction average of at least 70%. Relevant degrees include:

Bachelor of Biomedicine
Bachelor of Pharmaceutical Sciences
Bachelor of Science

Prerequisite studies in Chemistry, English and Mathematics must be met at the VCE or tertiary level, as well as a physiology unit at the tertiary level.

STEP 2: pharmacy degree

Apply for any of the undergraduate entry pharmacy degrees at Monash. You will be able to enter at third year of the degree providing you complete and pass a 6.5-week summer semester unit.

Subject adjustments

Applicants can receive up to 6 adjustments onto their VCE aggregate for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. Adjustments are added automatically, and you won't have to apply for them. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were Biology and Physics. Eligible subjects for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.


Applicants can receive adjustment factors for disadvantage that has impacted their education. Applicants can apply for this scheme via the Victorian Tertiary
Admissions Centre (VTAC) between 29 July – 11 October 2024 after creating their VTAC account and adding course preferences.

MONASH GUARANTEE

Applicants eligible for the Monash Guarantee program will be guaranteed entry into the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) or the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) / Master of Pharmacy with an ATAR of at least 78, providing they meet entry requirements and preference the course in their VTAC account correctly.

Applicants apply for the scheme by ticking 'yes' to SEAS Category 1 – Personal Information and Location. Applications will open on 29 July 2024 via VTAC.

Note: the ATAR of 78 is relevant for the 2024 intake and may change for the 2025 intake.

EARLY ENTRY PROGRAM

Schools Recommendation Scheme: apply for this scheme via the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC). Selection is based on year 11 results and ratings from your school on personal competencies. Applicants may be eligible to receive an ATAR free offer for the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours).

BOOST YOUR SELECTION RANK!

Adjustment factors are additional points that can be added to your Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) to boost your selection rank and help you get into your chosen course. A maximum of 20 adjustment factors can be added to your ATAR to create your selection rank. At UC, we award adjustment factors in three ways: subject adjustment factors, Educational Access Scheme (via UAC), and university priority groups). Read more here.
