
Undergraduate

TELL ME ABOUT OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Occupational therapists are like the superheroes of getting people back on their feet after tough times like injuries, illnesses, or disabilities.

They don't just look at the injury itself, they think about everything going on in someone's life - like what makes them happy, what challenges they're facing at home, work, or school, and what goals they want to reach.

They come up with cool and creative ways to help people do everyday stuff on their own again, making life feel a bit more normal. Whether it's helping a student in school who's struggling, someone recovering from a bad accident in hospital, or grandparents wanting to stay active, occupational therapists are all about turning "I can't" into "I can!".

Are there jobs?

Yes. There were 23,900 occupational therapists in 2021. Numbers are likely to reach 25,600 by 2026. Check up to date info on Labour Market Insights and research jobs on seek.com.

Will I have to go to uni?

Yes. You can only become a qualified occupational therapist through studying an accredited degree at uni.

Not ready for uni?

VET is an amazing way to start your OT journey. You can study a variety of courses related to supporting people through studying at a registered training organisation such as a TAFE or through a traineeship. Not only will you engage in industry experience, you'll be qualified to work in that industry while you study at uni.

While a VET course won't provide guaranteed entry into a Bachelor of Occupational Therapy at a Victorian university, it can boost your chances of gaining entry, depending on your secondary school results, the VET qualification level, and if the course is 'graded'. You can search for courses via the Victorian Skills Gateway and for traineeships via a job search site such as seek.com.

The following are three entry level courses you could consider.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

What is the course?

Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care.

Why should I consider early childhood?

This course is fantastic for people interested in working in paediatric occupational therapy, or occupational therapy in an education setting such as a primary school or early learning centre.

ALLIED HEALTH

What is the course?

Certificate IV in Allied Health Assistance (Occupational Therapy).

Why should I consider allied health assistance?

You will be qualified to work as an occupational therapy assistant and will gain an excellent introduction to the rehabilitation industry.

INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT

What is the course?

Certificate III in Individual Support.

Why should I consider studying this course?

You can specialise in either aged care or disability. Both specialisations will prepare you to work with people in these industry areas.





STEP 1: Secondary school studies

Study VCE subjects such as Biology, Health And Human Development, Psychology, Physical Education, and Mathematics. Achieve a competitive ATAR.

STEP 2: complete an accredited occupational therapy degree

Complete an accredited undergraduate or graduate entry degree at one of the following universities:

La Trobe University
Charles Sturt University
Monash University
Australian Catholic University
Federation University
Deakin University
Swinburne University

You will need to meet English language requirements, inherent requirements (e.g., communication skills), and academic entry requirements for course admission. You may also be required to get or prove you have certain immunisations and get Police Record, Working with Children and NDIS screening checks.

Register with the Occupational Therapy Board via AHPRA (Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency) as a student OT.

STEP 3: Registration

Apply to register with the Occupational Therapy Board so you can work as an accredited Occupational Therapist.

STEP 4: Renew your registration each year

Renew your registration each year and ensure you meet the registration standards (i.e., continuing professional development hours).

STEP 5: Further studies

Increase your skills and competencies by undertaking further studies in areas of interest such as play therapy, mental health, or research.

What ATAR will I need?

When it comes to the ATAR, there are three ways Year 12 leavers can gain direct entry into an occupational therapy degree in Victoria – achieving a selection rank above the lowest rank for the relevant intake, achieving above the guaranteed ATAR, or receiving a place in the ACU Guarantee program.

SELECTION RANK

Universities use the 'selection rank' when assessing course applications.

The selection rank is your ATAR plus any adjustment factors taken into consideration by the university (e.g., equity and academic adjustments).

Adjustment factors are added to your combined study scores (VCE aggregate) and your ATAR is re-ranked.

Your selection rank will be different for each course at each university as each institute uses their own adjustment programs.

You won't know what your selection rank is, but you'll need to achieve a rank above the 'lowest selection rank' for the relevant intake year.

NO ATAR

Australian Catholic University offers the Bachelor of Occupational Therapy at the Melbourne and Ballarat campuses.

They have an early entry program called 'ACU Guarantee'.
Successful applicants can receive a conditional 'ATAR free' offer for the course through this program.

The University calculates a selection rank using your Year 11 grades. The selection rank can be boosted through providing up to three personal statements.

The conditions of the early offer program are successfully completing Year 12, achieving course prerequisites, and ordering your VTAC preferences correctly.

Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours)

La Trobe's Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours) provides you with the clinical knowledge, professional skills and industry connections needed to launch your career. In this 4-year degree you will hone your professional skills with 1,000 hours of placement in Australia's leading health organisations, learn from experts in paediatrics, musculoskeletal, neurology and mental health practice, and develop clinical skills in purpose built facilities with hands-on workshops and practice simulations.

GRADUATE ENTRY

Master of Occupational Therapy Practice La Trobe also offers an accredited Occupational Therapy qualification at the graduate level. Below is the entry pathway:

Step 1

Complete a bachelor degree that has a specialisation in one of the following areas: health, education, social, psychological or biological sciences.

Achieve a Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of at least 65%.

Step 2

Apply for the 2-year Master of Occupational Therapy Practice.

Via a La Trobe University Diploma course

STEP 1: Diploma in Health Sciences Complete the 1-year Diploma at the Melbourne campus.

STEP 2: Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours)

Apply for the 4-year occupational therapy degree.

Via a La Trobe University bachelor degree

STEP 1: Bachelor degree

Complete at least the first year of one of the following 3-year degrees:

Health Science (Melbourne, Bendigo, Online).

Biomedicine (Melbourne).

Biomedical Science (Albury-Wodonga, Bendigo).

Bachelor of Exercise Science (Bendigo). Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Science (Melbourne).

STEP 2: Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours)

Apply for the 4-year occupational therapy degree.

SELECTION RANK ADJUSTMENTS

If eligible, La Trobe will add adjustment factors to your VCE aggregate to recalculate your ATAR and boost your selection rank for entry into their courses. For example, your ATAR might be 60 but after adjustment factors are added, your selection rank might be 72.5. Adjustment factors are calculated from initiatives such as the following. Note - if you're eligible for multiple initiatives, the maximum aggregate adjustments you can receive is 20.

Subject adjustments

Applicants can receive a maximum of 12 adjustments for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were: Biology, Chemistry, any Mathematics, and LOTE. Adjustments for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.

Priority Access Program

A maximum of 15 adjustment factors are awarded to applicants who fall within any of the following categories: priority school (5), priority campus (5), regional school (5).

Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

Applicants can receive a maximum of 20 adjustment factors for disadvantage that has impacted their education. Applicants can apply for SEAS via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) between 29 July – 11 October 2024 after creating their VTAC account and adding course preferences.

Elite Athlete ATAR Adjustment

Applicants can receive up to 5 aggregate adjustments. Click here for information.

Rural and Regional Student Access Scheme (RRSAS)

Students residing in an area classified as RA2 or higher are eligible for the following adjustments:

Regional students applying to courses at the Melbourne (Bundoora) campus will receive 5 aggregate points.

Regional students applying to courses at Bendigo, Albury Wodonga, Mildura and Shepparton will receive 10 aggregate points.

The following are examples of pathways into the undergraduate entry occupational therapy degree. Note – there are no guaranteed pathway courses into the degree.

Via a VET pathway

STEP 1: Diploma or Advanced Diploma

Complete a graded Diploma or Advanced Diploma at a registered training organisation such as a TAFE.

STEP 2: Occupational Therapy

Apply for the Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours). Admission into the degree will be based on academic merit from the VET course and applicants should have at least a minimum 70% average. Applicants must have completed the VCE subject prerequisites, and the entire academic record of the applicant will be taken into consideration (ATAR + VET grades).

Via a higher education pathway

STEP 1: tertiary study

Complete at least one year of full-time study (48 credit points) of a recognised university degree with a minimum average mark of 70%.

STEP 2: Occupational Therapy

Apply for the Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours). Applicants must have completed the VCE subject prerequisites or equivalent university units to be eligible. Admission to this course is competitive and applicants may need to meet a higher requirement to be offered a place.

SELECTION RANK ADJUSTMENTS

If eligible, Monash will add adjustment factors to your VCE aggregate to recalculate your ATAR and boost your selection rank for entry into their courses. For example, your ATAR might be 60 but after adjustment factors are added, your selection rank might be 70. Adjustment factors are calculated from initiatives such as the following:

Subject adjustments

Applicants can receive up to 6 adjustments for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were Biology, Chemistry, Geography, Health And Human Development, Physical Education, and Psychology. Eligible subjects for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.

Elite Student Athlete and Performer Entry Scheme

Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

Applicants can receive adjustment factors for disadvantage that has impacted their education. Applicants can apply for SEAS via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) between 29 July – 11 October 2024 after creating their VTAC account and adding course preferences.



account correctly. Applicants apply for the
scheme via SEAS. Applications will open on
29 July via VTAC and close on 11 October

Monash Indigenous Entry Scheme

This is an alternative entry into the Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours) for applicants who are First Nations Australian. Choose the 'Indigenous Entry' tagged course via VTAC. Applicants will need to achieve a minimum ATAR of 50, meet course entry requirements, and submit a supplementary information form. Click here for information.
