

How to become an oral health therapist



WHAT IS AN ORAL HEALTH THERAPIST?

An oral health therapist is a dual-qualified dental professional trained in both dental therapy and dental hygiene. These practitioners provide a range of oral health care services, primarily focusing on prevention, treatment, and maintenance of oral health. Their duties include performing dental examinations, taking X-rays, cleaning teeth, applying preventive materials, conducting oral health promotion activities, and providing restorative treatments under the prescription of a dentist. Oral health therapists provide dental therapy services to children and adolescents and dental hygiene services to people of all ages.

WHY ORAL HEALTH THERAPISTS ARE AMAZING

Oral health therapists are amazing because they play a crucial role in preventive dental care, reducing the incidence of dental diseases. Their expertise in both therapy and hygiene allows them to offer comprehensive care, promote oral health education, and provide treatments that maintain the well-being of patients across all ages.

WHAT YOU NEED TO CONSIDER

Being an oral health therapist can be physically demanding, with long hours spent in awkward positions causing strain. The role can also involve high stress due to tight schedules and patient anxiety. Additionally, the scope of practice is limited, which may restrict the range of treatments they can provide.

STUDYING ORAL HEALTH

To be eligible to study oral health at university applicants will need to:

- Meet academic and English language requirements.
- Meet inherent requirements.

To be eligible to participate in clinical placements, students will need to obtain:

- Police Record Check
- Working with Children Check
- First Aid/CPR Certificate
- Immunisation and testing for blood born viruses.

Students will be required to pay for their own transport and accommodation when travelling to participate in clinical placements.

BACHELOR OF ORAL HEALTH SCIENCE

Oral health therapists provide oral health care including the prevention and treatment of dental decay and gum diseases. They work closely with other dental professionals including dentists and dental specialists and are highly skilled in oral health promotion.

Our course has a strong focus on oral health care services in rural and regional areas and you will do a practical placement in rural Victoria. Study basic sciences and public health and start preclinical dentistry in your first semester in our state-of-the-art clinical simulation laboratory.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

Clinical placements form an important part of our program and take place primarily in Bendigo at our 20-chair clinical facility at the Anne Caudle campus. You may do other placements in third year across a wide range of locations including special needs areas, nursing homes, schools and community health centres and internationally.

Before starting your last semester, you must complete a summer semester that includes a two-week placement at either a rural Victorian dentistry practice or overseas, before returning to our Bendigo Campus to finish your studies.

PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

The Bachelor of Oral Health Science is accredited by the Australian Dental Council. Graduates may be eligible to apply for registration with the Dental Board of Australia.

FIRST NATIONS AUSTRALIAN ENTRY

This is an alternative entry into the Bachelor of Oral Health Science for applicants who are First Nations Australian. Choose the 'First Nation Australian' tagged course via VTAC.

Apply via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre. Applications will open for Year 12 students on 29 July 2024.

STEP 2: Bachelor of Oral Health Science Apply for the Bachelor of Oral Health Science.

STEP 1: Bachelor degree

Complete at least the first year of one of the following 3-year degrees:

Health Sciences (Melbourne, Bendigo, Online) Biomedicine (Melbourne) Biomedical Science (Albury-Wodonga, Bendigo).

STEP 2: Bachelor of Oral Health Science Apply for the Bachelor of Oral Health Science.

BOOST YOUR SELECTION RANK!

If eligible, La Trobe will add adjustment factors to your VCE aggregate to recalculate your ATAR and boost your selection rank for entry into their courses. For example, your ATAR might be 60 but after adjustment factors are added, your selection rank might be 72.5. Adjustment factors are calculated from initiatives such as the following.

Subject adjustments

Applicants can receive a maximum of 12 adjustments for high achievement in eligible Units 3 and 4 subjects. In the 2024 intake, the eligible subjects were: Science, Health And Human Development, any Mathematics, Physical Education and LOTE. Adjustments for the 2025 intake will be advertised via VTAC from 29 July 2024.

Priority Access Program

Adjustment factors are awarded to applicants who fall within any of the following categories: priority school (5), priority campus (5), regional school (5). The maximum adjustment factors physiotherapy applicants can receive overall and across all categories is 10.

Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

Applicants can receive a maximum of 20 adjustment factors for disadvantage that has impacted their education. Applicants can apply for this scheme via the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) between 29 July – 11 October 2024 after creating their VTAC account and adding course preferences.

Elite Athlete ATAR Adjustment

Applicants can receive up to 5 aggregate adjustments. Click here for information.

Rural and Regional Student Access Scheme (RRSAS)

Students residing in an area classified as RA2 or higher are eligible for the following adjustments:

Regional students applying to courses at the Melbourne (Bundoora) campus will receive 5 aggregate points.

Regional students applying to courses at Bendigo, Albury Wodonga, Mildura and Shepparton will receive 10 aggregate points.

BACHELOR OF ORAL HEALTH

You will learn alongside dental students at the Melbourne Dental School in a high-tech clinical setting. You will also have the opportunity to undertake placements in metropolitan clinics and rural areas. You will learn from a clinical teaching team including active practitioners and world-leading academics who bring international leadership, research and policy expertise to the degree.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

In the first two years, you'll undertake clinical work at the Royal Dental Hospital. In the final year, clinical rotations are undertaken at community clinics in metropolitan and rural locations.

The Bachelor of Oral Health has combined vocational outcomes in hygiene and therapy.

HYGIENE

Dental hygienists provide dental care for all age groups. They examine and record the nature and severity of periodontal conditions, and clean, scale and root-plane teeth.

THERAPY

Dental therapists provide dental care for children and adolescents. They examine oral and dental conditions, restore and conserve permanent and deciduous teeth, perform extractions of deciduous teeth, and remove calculus. Under recent changes dental therapists are also able to provide care to adults under certain circumstances.

Course Prerequisites Campus Bachelor of Oral Health Minimum study score of 30 in English (EAL) or 25 in any other Parkville English; and a minimum study score of 25 in one of Chemistry or Biology. Chemistry or Biology.

PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

The Bachelor of Oral Health is recognised in all Australian states and territories and in New Zealand and is accredited by the Australian Dental Council (ADC). Students will register as dental practitioners with the Australian Health Practitioners Regulation Agency (AHPRA) upon graduation.

ABORIGINAL AND/OR TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER STUDENTS

Under the Access Melbourne Scheme, the guaranteed ATAR for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander applicants is 77.00. To apply for this Access Melbourne category, submit a SEAS application via VTAC under SEAS Category 1: Personal information and location. Murrup Barak will be in touch with applicants to help them submit a confirmation of identity document.

PATHWAYS

The following are examples of pathways into the Bachelor of Oral Health. Note: application for the course is competitive and there is no guaranteed pathway into the degree.

Via higher education studies - you have less than one year (1 EFTSL) of completed studies.

STEP 1: higher education studies

Complete higher education studies. Your entire academic record will be considered and both your ATAR (or other final secondary result) and your WAM will be considered. If you've completed less than a year (1 EFTSL) of higher education study and don't have a secondary qualification assessed by the University as equivalent to the VCE, you won't be eligible for entry.

STEP 2: Bachelor of Oral Health Apply for the Bachelor of Oral Health Science. Achieve English language requirements.

Via higher education studies – you have one year (1 EFTSL) of completed studies.

STEP 1: higher education studies

Complete a year of higher education studies. Generally, your WAM will be primary factor in assessment, particularly if your study is in a relevant discipline.

STEP 2: Bachelor of Oral Health Science Apply for the Bachelor of Oral Health Science. Achieve English language requirements.

ACCESS MELBOURNE

Our Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) is designed to support students who have faced unique circumstances throughout their schooling to gain entry into their preferred undergraduate degree at Melbourne.

Access Melbourne categories takes the following personal circumstances into consideration as part of your application:

Disadvantaged financial background
Resident of a regional or remote area
Recognition as an Indigenous Australian
First in family
Graduate of an under-represented school
Difficult circumstances
Disability or medical condition
Non-English speaking background.

How to apply

Step 1: Create your VTAC account

From the 29th of July 2024 you will be able to create your Victorian Tertiary Admissions
Centre (VTAC) account and add in at least one course preference.

Step 2: submit a SEAS application

Submit an application for the Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) in your VTAC account between 29 July to 11 October 2024. There are four categories. Applicants must ensure they apply under the SEAS category that aligns with their Access Melbourne category.

For example:

Access Melbourne: 'resident of a regional or remote area'.

To apply for this Access Melbourne category, submit a SEAS application via VTAC under SEAS Category 1: Personal information and location.

Note: you may need to provide evidence depending on the category.

CHARLES STURT UNIVERSITY

Wagga Wagga, Chadstone.

Accredited by the Australian Dental Council. Graduates are eligible for registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA).

Graduates are able to provide hygiene treatment to individuals of all ages and dental therapy care to children and young adults (up to age 26).

Graduates are eligible for registration in New Zealand.

Towards the end of your degree, you may be able to apply to embark on a short study tour to Cambodia.



The fully accredited Bachelor of Oral Health (Therapy and Hygiene) from Charles Sturt University qualifies you to work as an oral health therapist in Australia. As a graduate, you'll help combat the national chronic shortage of oral health professionals, while also making a valuable contribution to the health of your community.

BACHELOR OF ORAL HEALTH (THERAPY AND HYGIENE)

Charles Sturt University offers this degree full-time over three years at the Wagga Wagga campus, or you can study the first two years of your course at the Holmesglen Institute's Chadstone campus in Melbourne.

If you are enrolled at the Holmesglen Institute, you'll undertake lectures and preclinical training in Years 1 and 2 at Holmesglen, then complete your degree (Year 3) on campus at Wagga Wagga. Towards the end of your degree, you may be able to apply to embark on a short study tour to Cambodia.

Graduates can pursue a career in general or specialist dental practice, public sector dental health, Australian defence forces (Army, Navy or Air Force), hospital dental clinics, education or research.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

Develop your practical skills in the state-ofthe-art simulation clinic, dental technology/clinical support laboratory, biodental science learning suite and anatomy teaching facilities. If you're studying at the Holmesglen Institute's Chadstone campus, you'll have access to a world-class oral health simulation facility.

Charles Sturt University has five dental and oral health clinics across their Albury-Wodonga, Bathurst, Dubbo, Orange and Wagga Wagga campuses. These clinics are open to patients from the local community and will provide some of your first professional training.

You could undertake placements at any Charles Sturt University clinic during your course, working under the supervision of qualified practitioners.

Apply for the Bachelor of Oral Health (Therapy and Hygiene).

SELECTION RANK ADJUSTMENTS

At Charles Sturt, you can receive up to 12 points of Adjustment Factors. These adjustment factors may be awarded across one or more of the following categories:

- Regional Location Adjustment (maximum 5 points)
- Subject Performance (maximum 10 points)
- Educational Disadvantage (maximum 7 points)

Adjustment factors are calculated automatically for applicants who apply via UAC, VTAC or direct to Charles Sturt

Regional Location Adjustment

Applicants who attend a regional high school will be awarded 5 adjustment points.

Subject performance

Applicants can receive up to 10 adjustment points for excellence in certain subjects.

Educational Disadvantage

Up to 7 adjustment points can be awarded for educational disadvantage.

Applicants applying via VTAC for the Chadstone campus can apply for adjustment factors via the Special Entry Access Scheme. Applicants applying for the Wagga Wagga campus via UAC can apply via the Educational Access Scheme.

SRS is an early entry scheme. Selection is based on Year 11 results and a school rating of your aptitudes. Successful applicants will receive a firm or a conditional offer via the UAC system for the Bachelor of Oral Health (Therapy and Hygiene) at the Wagga Wagga campus. Applications open 3 April for NSW students and August for Victorian students, and close on 16 September 2024. Click here.

Central Coast Ourimbah campus

This program is accredited by the Australian Dental Council.

Graduates will be eligible to register with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA), Dental Board of Australia as Oral Health Therapists and to practise as dental hygienists and therapists in private and public dental practice and work in oral health promotion in a range of clinical settings.

Admission to the Bachelor of Health Science (Honours) is available to students who achieve the required grade-point average

Our oral health therapy students graduate with dual qualifications in dental hygiene and dental therapy. This degree has a strong focus on disease prevention, world class simulation and an advanced restorative scope.

BACHELOR OF ORAL HEALTH THERAPY

When you study to be an oral health professional, you will learn skills in oral health that can make a real difference and shape a healthier future for children and adults. Work closely with professional dental practitioners and learn to perform a range of preventative and minor restorative tasks, educate your community on best practices, and discover emerging methods for controlling and treating disease.

You will acquire your pre-clinical skills in our simulation laboratory using innovative technology including virtual reality. You will also hone your oral health therapeutic techniques using our on-campus oral health clinic and simulation laboratory, featuring 17 dental chairs and life-like manikins.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

Oral health therapy students will complete up to 1000 supervised clinical placement hours split between their second and final year. You will develop your skills in our oncampus oral health clinic and simulation laboratory. Later in your degree, you will undertake clinical placements in rural and urban regions across NSW and rest of Australia.

GUARANTEED ENTRY PROGRAM

The Bachelor of Oral Health Therapy isn't an eligible course for the Guaranteed Entry program. This includes the following entry programs: VET qualifications (Certificate IV+), University of Newcastle enabling programs, and University of Newcastle pathway programs.

SCHOOLS RECOMMENDATION SCHEME (SRS)

SRS is an early entry scheme. Selection is based on Year 11 results and a school rating of your aptitudes. Successful applicants will receive a firm or a conditional offer via the UAC system for the Bachelor of Oral Health Therapy. Applications open 3 April for NSW students and August for Victorian students, and close on 16 September 2024. Click here.

PATHWAY

If you have completed or partially completed higher education studies, your grade point average can be converted into a selection rank for admission into the Bachelor of Oral Health Therapy.

The Bachelor of Oral Health program has been fully accredited for the full five years by the Australian Dental Council.

Graduates are eligible for registration with the Dental Board of Australia and are licensed with the Environmental Protection Authority to use diagnostic radiation.

Graduates qualify to register with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency as an oral health therapist.

BACHELOR OF ORAL HEALTH THERAPY

The Bachelor of Oral Health is an undergraduate coursework degree that will prepare you for professional practice as an oral health therapist. Over three years you will develop the skills to prevent disease and manage oral health conditions with an adult restorative scope of practice.

You will graduate with a dual qualification in dental hygiene and dental therapy.

Graduates are eligible to register with the Dental Board of Australia and are licensed to use diagnostic radiation.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

You will complete a minimum of 1,500 hours of practical experience over three years. You'll participate in clinical placements offered at the Westmead Centre for Oral Health, Sydney Dental Hospital, Nepean Dental Health Clinic and other Local Health District dental hospitals.

Applicants living in an eligible location will have a lower minimum ATAR requirement of 86 for the Bachelor of Oral Health.
